TravelWatch *East Midlands* – the independent body promoting passenger transport in the Region, today expressed disappointment at the announced the January 2007 fares increases, which hit the East Midlands particularly harshly.

Whilst train companies are raising their regulated fares by 4.3% (inflation plus 1%) and unregulated fares by an <u>average</u> of 4.7%, the increase in East Midlands unregulated fares is even higher - Midland Mainline 5.9% and Central Trains 5.7%. This comes on top of the increase in many bus fares (e.g; Arriva – this week).

TravelWatch *East Midlands* Chairman, Alan Meredith said: "*This above-inflation price hike, on top of already high fares will be a poor New Year present for passengers – at the same time some East Midlands services are at risk from the planned new franchise*"

Passengers can't even depend upon the service, those using Central Trains are currently being faced with regular cancellations, particularly on Sundays. "In today's 24-7 lifestyle, it's not unreasonable to expect a 7 day/week railway, Instead Central passengers are being asked to pay premium prices for second rate services"

Passengers can still get relatively good value travel if they can afford a season ticket or can book in advance. However, trains are becoming fuller by the day.

"However, passengers wanting flexibility or who have no choice about when they travel have no alternative but to pay the highest prices. – People are being priced off the railways, even off-peak, as prices increase and the "cheap offers" are harder to find."

"The future could be even blacker if the bidders cut corners in order to minimise their costs and win government approval to run the new franchise".
